The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools and because it is an apportunity to set the stage for the continued craz ton of a safe, equitable and inclusive school-environment as the school year begins. Orange Shirt Day is also an apportunity for First Nettons, local governments, schools and communities to come tage their in the spirit of reconciliation and happe for generations of children to come.
