This year we have had an increase in the number of students attending our Kindergarten program at Carruthers Creek Public School. As a result, we were required by the Ministry of Education to reorganize our Kindergarten classes to meet their guidelines. We would like to welcome our newest Coyote Ms. Arruda. She will be joining Mrs. Dobbin's class as it becomes a full Kindergarten class of 28 students with a teacher and ECE instead of a class of 15 students with only a teacher.
